## Goals

- To learn about the course selection process.
- To consider the next steps.
- To be prepared to schedule 8 credits for the next school year.


## How to Prepare

- Review course selection resources and Graduation Requirements found on the Counseling website.
- Familiarize yourself with the Course Selection Guide.
- Review course descriptions, prerequisites, credit values, etc. in detail.
- Talk with your parent(s)/guardian(s) about course and leveling options.


## Scheduling Considerations

- Course selections should align with academic and career plans.
- Course selections and levels should be consistent with ability and work ethic.
- How can I best balance rigor and success?
- Have discussions with teachers, parents/guardians, and counselors.


## Teacher Recommendations

- Core classes (English, Math, Social Studies, and Science) are recommended by teachers and preloaded into the online system.
- Recommendations are based on classroom performance, aptitudes, and work ethic while also taking into consideration the requirements and rigor of the sequential course.


## Academic Levels

- Levels:
- Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP)
- College Prep (CP)
- Career Track(CT)
- Students may ask to waive a teacher's recommendation by completing the Course Level Waiver Request form that can be found on the Counseling website.

- Listed above are the required courses for each grade level.
- It is recommended that students schedule World Language to fulfill post high school application requirements.
- The Course Selection Guide is filled with electives in many subject areas.
- Please check prerequisites before scheduling electives.
- Requesting an elective does not guarantee that the student will receive the elective.
- Considerations when choosing electives:
- Explore areas of interest further
- Take classes that you would enjoy
- Take electives that align with career/college plans


## Other Considerations

- Delaware County Technical School (DCTS) - Technical Programs
- Medical Careers Program (12 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ grade only)
- Dual Enrollment at Delaware County Community College (DCCC)
- Contact your counselor and or grade level principal to discuss these options.


## Technical School Programs:

- Blocks 1 and 2: students attend technical programs at DCTS
- Blocks 3 and 4: students attend academic classes at HHS
- Over 19 different courses of study


## Medical Careers Program:

- Block 1: students attend Medical Careers Program
- Blocks 2, 3 and 4: students attend academic classes at HHS


## Dual Enrollment at DCCC

Who is eligible? Generally Seniors who are:

- In good standing and on track to complete required courses/graduation credits prior to expected graduation date (if you want to start earlier contact your school counselor).
- Students who wish to try out college courses to determine whether or not this is the right path for them, and/or wish to earn college credits during the last semester of their high school career.
- Specific details can be found in the Course Selection Guide.
- Students are responsible for all transportation, tuition, fees, books and supplies.


## Consult with your School Counselor to:

- Answer questions concerning course selection.
- Ensure you are meeting course prerequisites and graduation requirements.
- Discuss Delaware County Technical School (including Medical Careers) or Dual Enrollment if interested.


## Online Registration

- Students select courses online by clicking on Class Registration in their Student Portal in PowerSchool.
- The online registration portal will open in February.
- Eight (8) credits equal a full schedule.
- Three (3) alternate elective courses should be selected.
- Please view the "how to complete your course selections" video on the counseling website. This video will walk you through the online registration process.
- Be sure to review your final course requests with a parent/guardian
- Carefully consider selections as changes are not always able to be accommodated.
