It is recommended that you choose ONE teacher to write you a letter of recommendation unless your school requires two. You must see a teacher in person and make a verbal request for a letter of recommendation OR communicate through email BEFORE you add a request in Naviance. Requests can be added in Naviance at the start of the 2021-2022 school year.

PA Career Readiness:

Please complete the most recent career readiness task: Completion of the Post High School Planning Reflection in Naviance. Details regarding Career Readiness can be found on the Counseling website under <u>PA Career</u> <u>Readiness Plan</u>.

Counselor Letter of Recommendation:

If your college requires a Counselor to write a Letter of Recommendation, please complete the Post High School Planning Reflection and Activities Record in Naviance. Also, it is helpful, but optional, if your parent/guardian completes the Parent Information Sheet in Naviance.

The Admissions Offices at Post High School Institutions are open and want to engage with prospective students. Please check each Post High School Institution's website to determine their options for virtual communication and in-person campus visits.

<u>Tips on Researching Post High School Institutions:</u>

- Talk to students who attend the Post High School Institution that you are interested in.
- Contact each school's admissions office and ask them to help you connect with a current student to ask them about their experience.
- Visit and delve into each school's website. Websites provide a wealth of information. Explore widely those things that matter to you.
- Sign up to be on the mailing list for every school you're considering. This will demonstrate your interest in the college, and keep you updated on happenings at the school: admissions information sessions, tours, and other programming opportunities.

Planning ahead:

- Continue to use and familiarize yourself with Naviance to identify your interests, research careers, and colleges, organize personal data, and maintain a list of prospective colleges.
- Continue to explore your post-high school options by gathering information. Visit and use the Counseling website, use the tools in Naviance, look at websites, and talk to friends, family, and recent graduates of Haverford to gather information on careers, majors, and schools.
- Attend virtual and in-person college and career events.
- Communicate with schools you want to learn more about.
- Explore possible summer opportunities (volunteering, employment, internship, or summer learning program).
- If you are interested in playing sports in college, research the <u>National College Athletic</u> <u>Association (NCAA) eligibility requirements</u>.
- If applicable, start to gather material for a portfolio (drama, music, art, sports, etc.).


College Board updates:

Plan on taking the PSAT in October 2021

The PSAT is practice for the SAT and is open to 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. It also qualifies 11th grade students for the National Merit Scholarship Program. The PSAT assesses the same knowledge and skills as the SAT, providing a check-in on college readiness before taking the SAT. Please look for registration information at the beginning of the school year.
