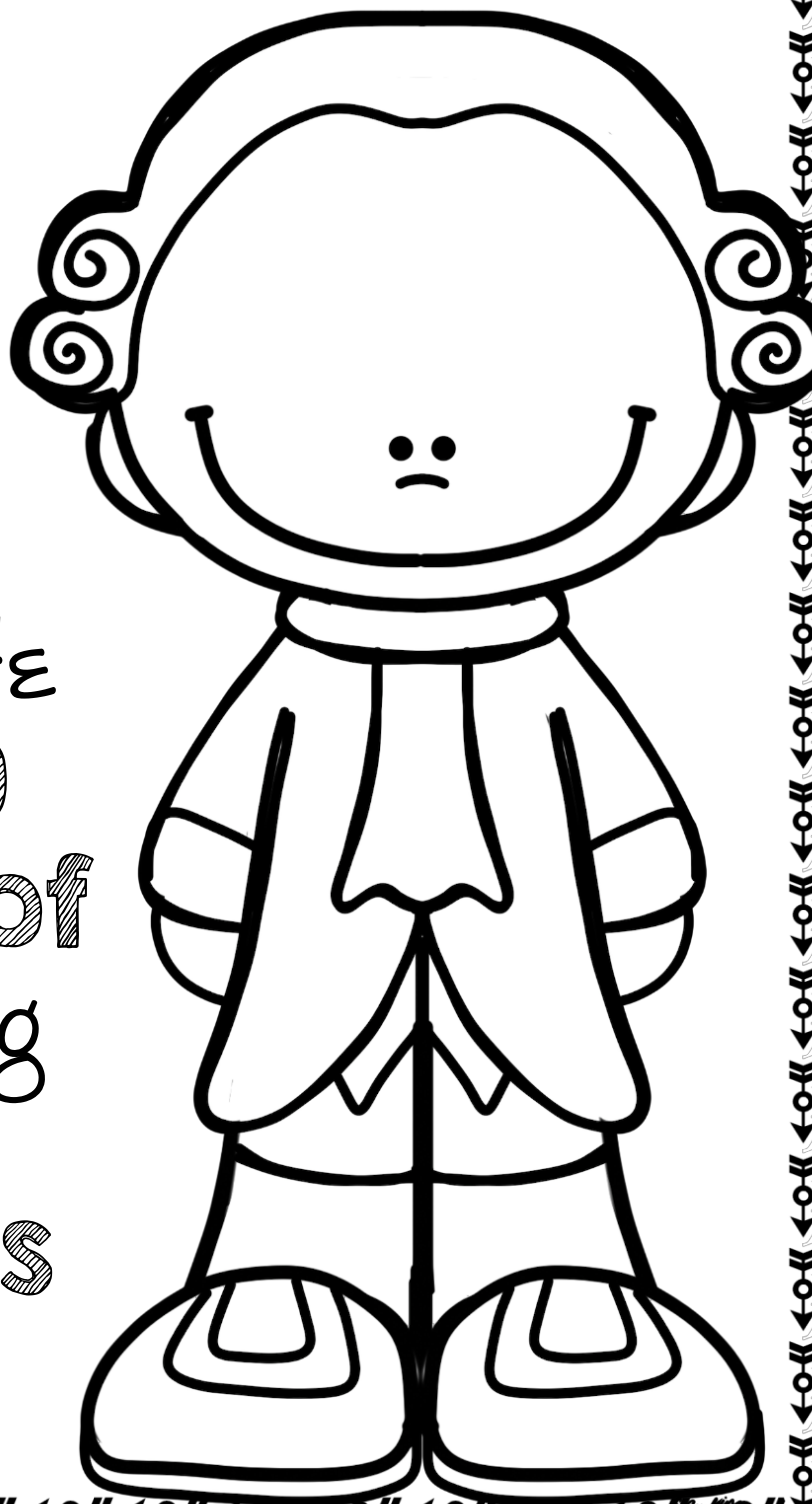




Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

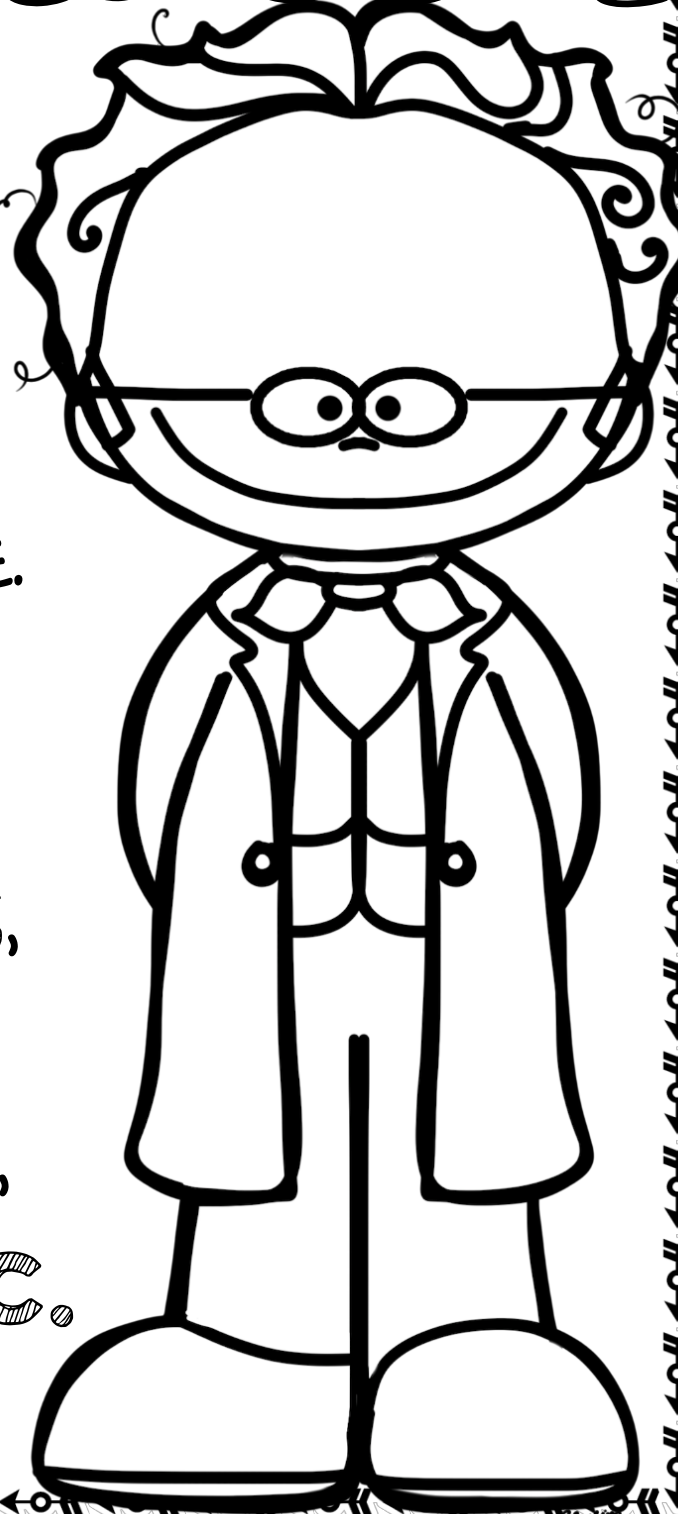
Mozart was a

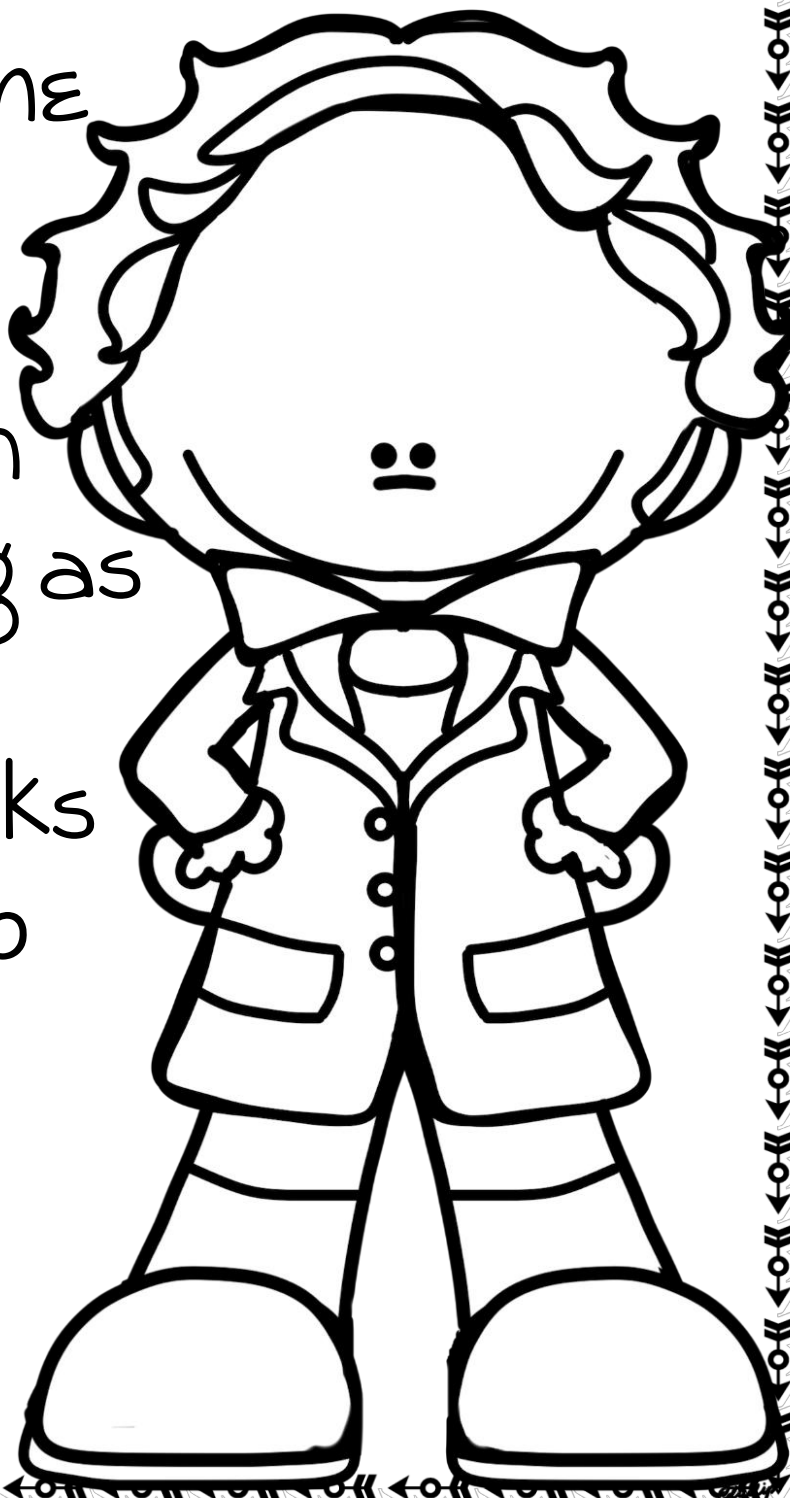
Schubert

Ludwig van Beethoven

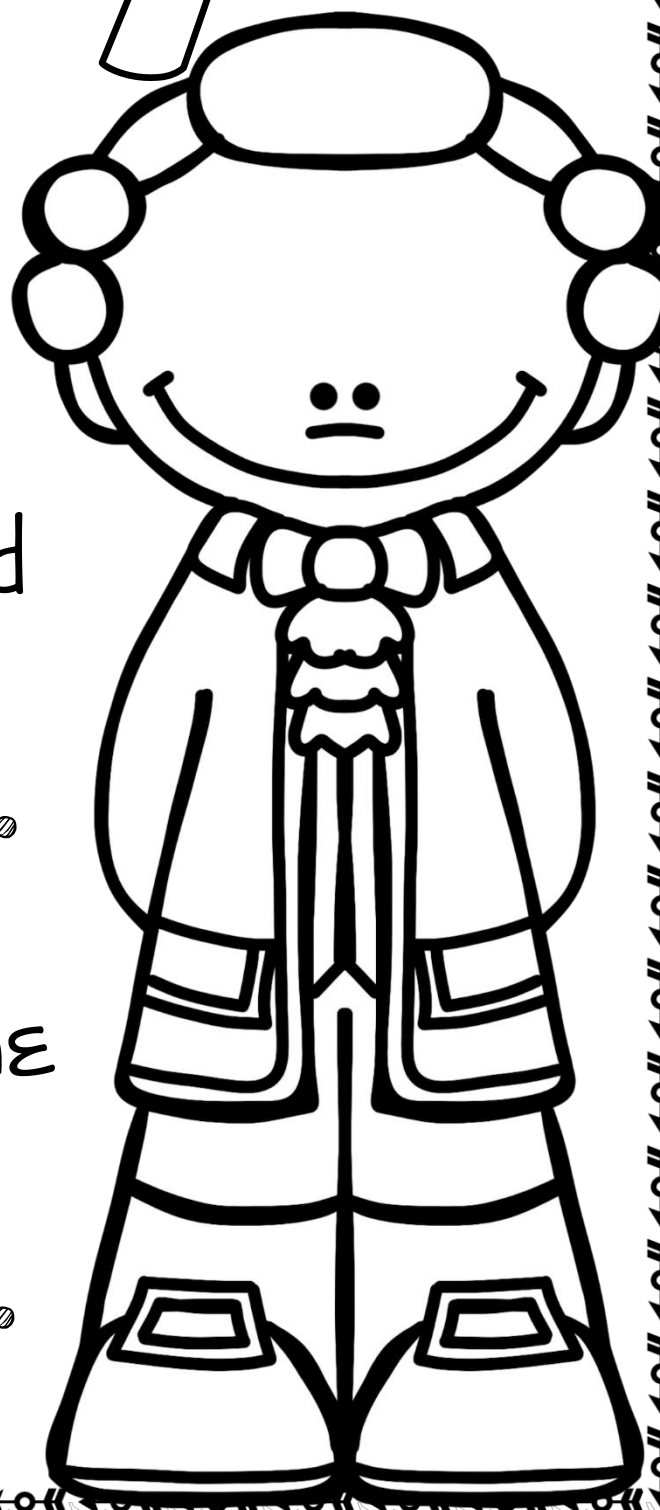
