Community Helper Tool Belt

Materials:

- ✓ sentence strips
- ✓ tool belt template (pages 10-12)
- ✓ crayon or markers
- ✓ glue
- ✓ scissors
- ✓ stapler



Directions:

1. Have students color and cut out the tool belt pictures of their choice on pages 11-12.
2. Give each student one "community helper" label for the front of their belt.
3. Glue the tools and label onto the sentence strip(s).
4. Fit the sentence strip onto the student's waist and secure with a stapler.
5. Discuss with the children how each tool represents a different community helper!

Tools included: magnifying glass (scientist/detective), hammer (construction worker), stethoscope (doctor/vet), toothbrush (dentist), ruler (teacher), cooking utensils (baker/chef), police badge (police officer), fire extinguisher (firefighter).

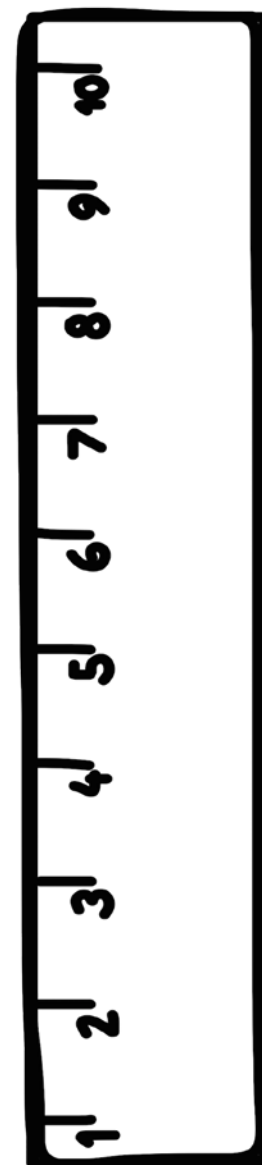
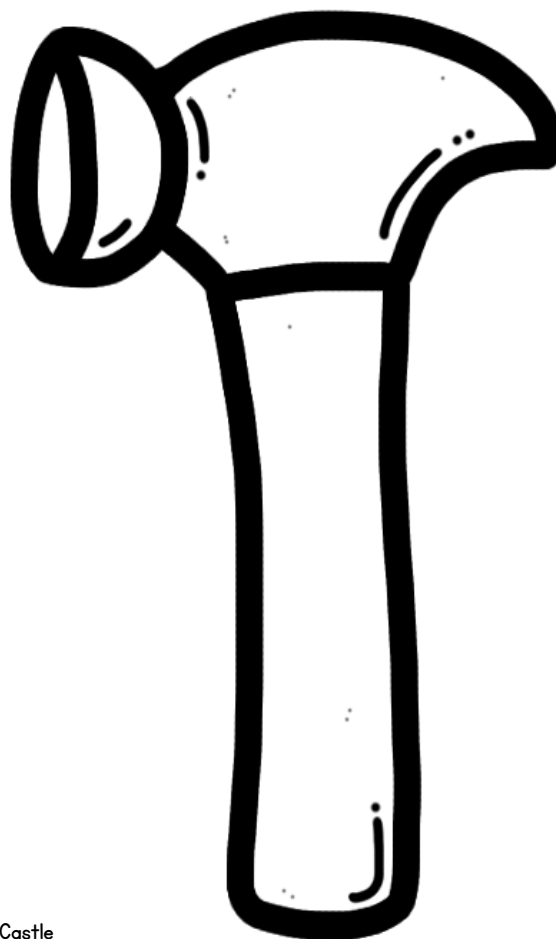


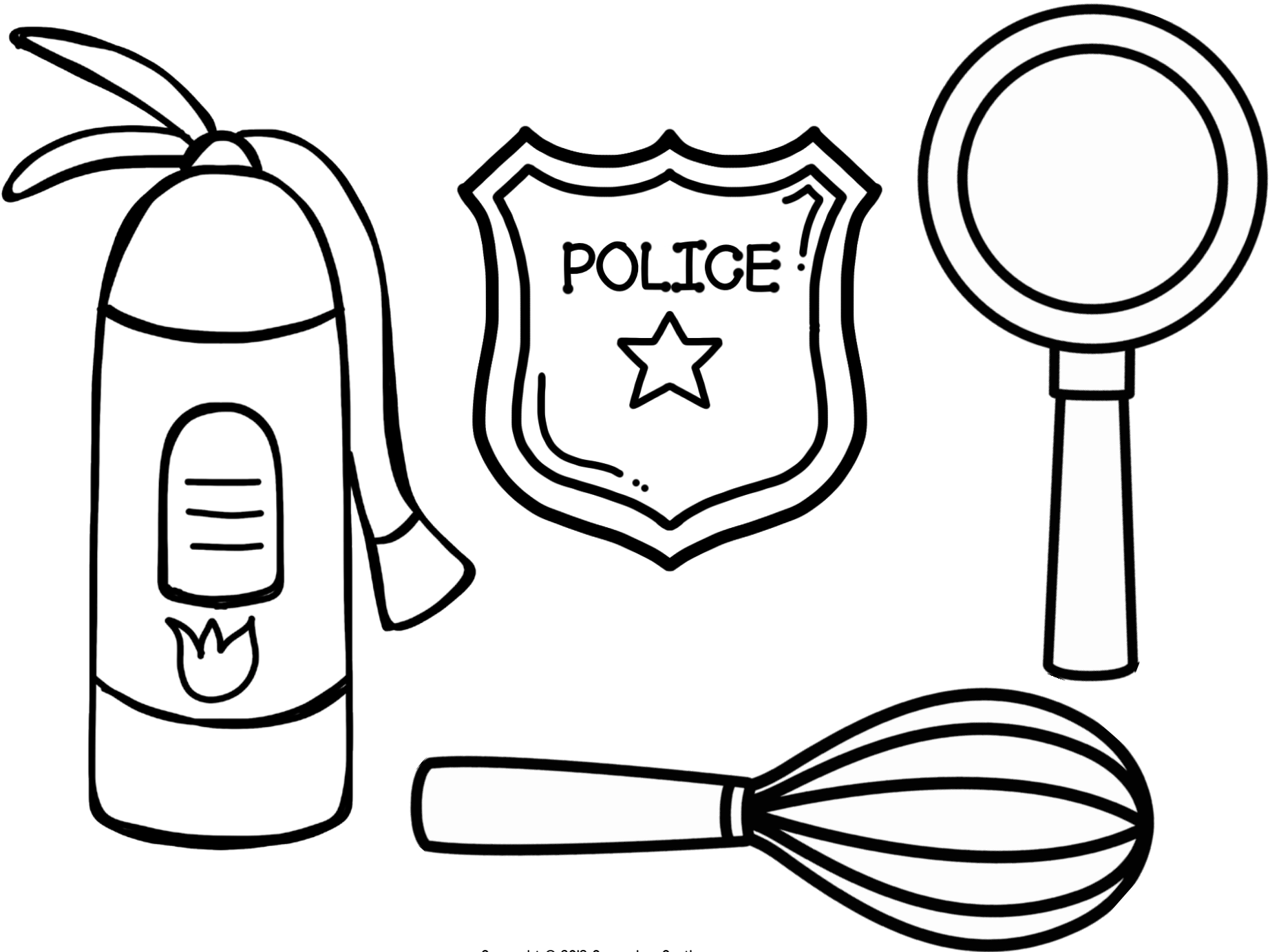

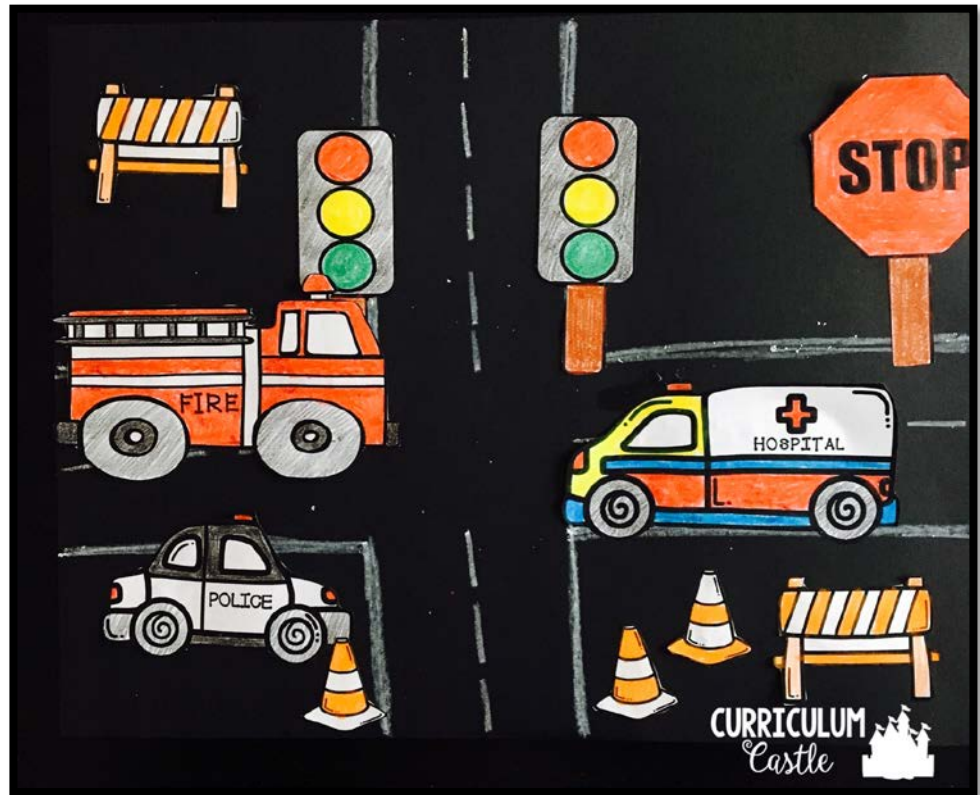




Helpers on the Road

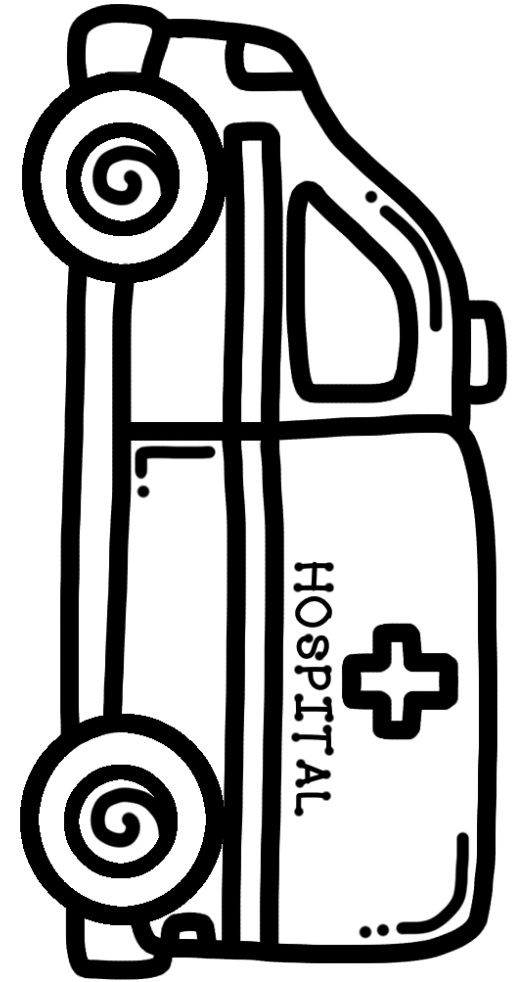
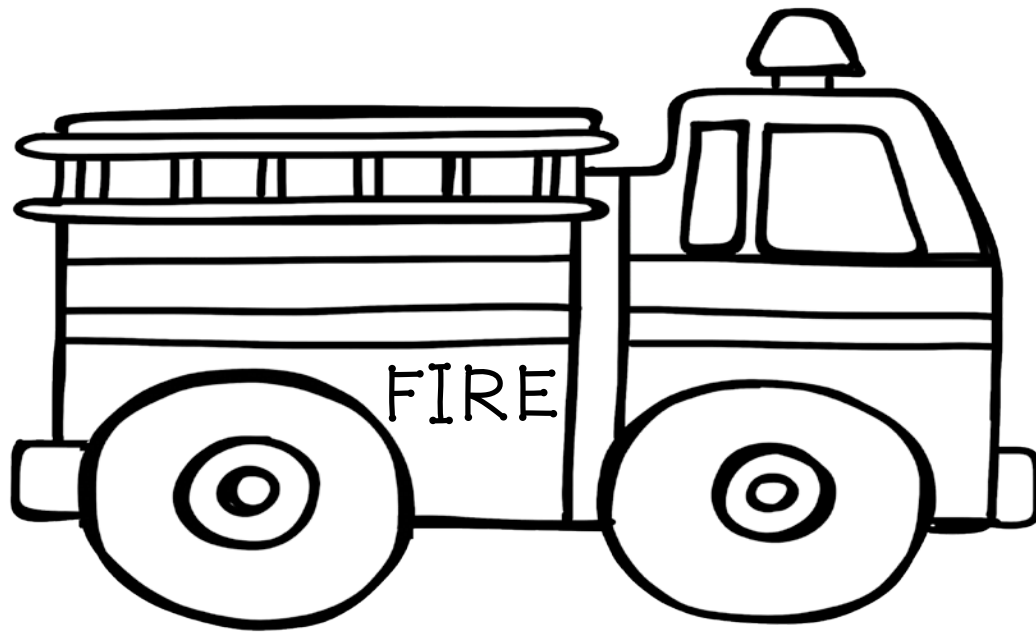
Materials:

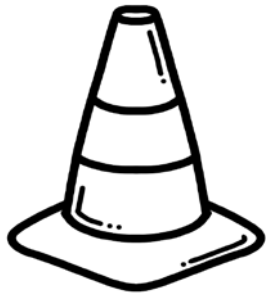
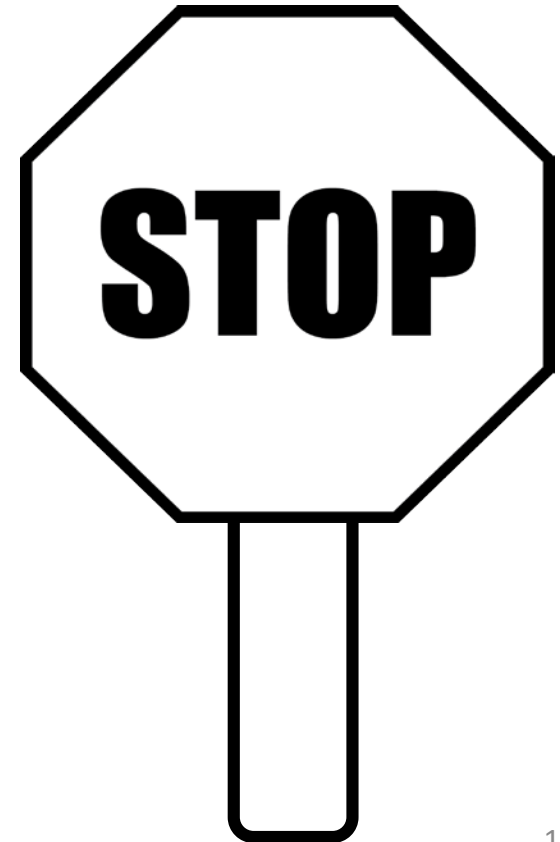
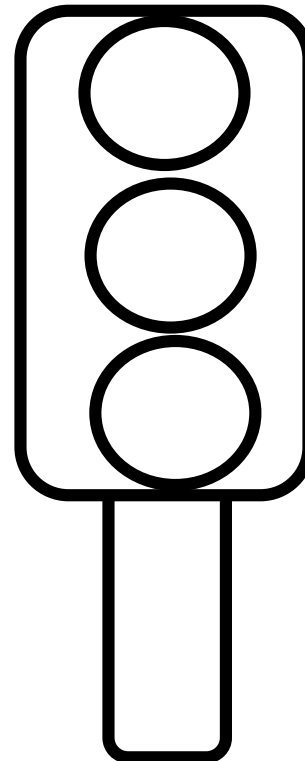
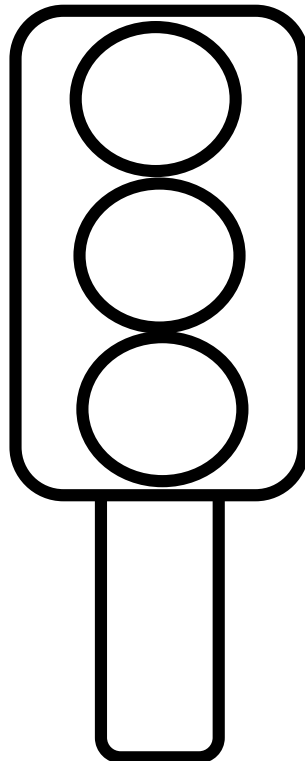
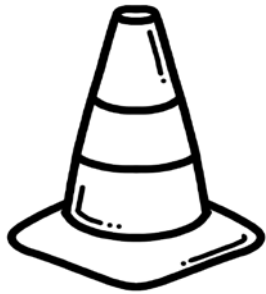
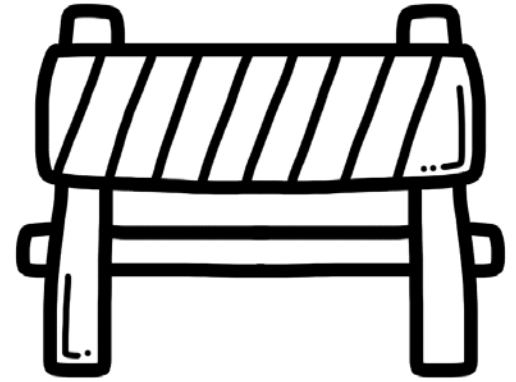
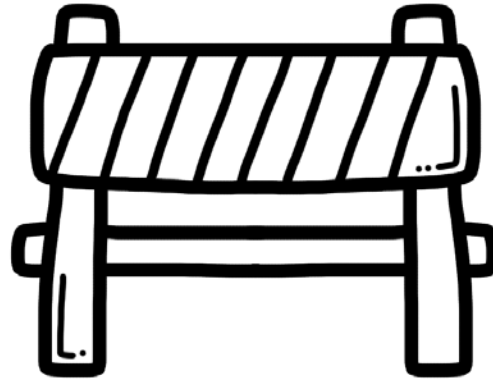
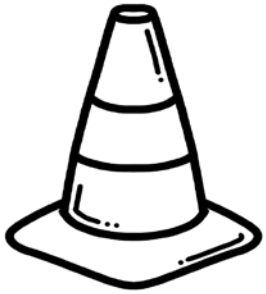
- ✓ black construction paper (large)
- ✓ helper vehicles template on pages 14-15
- ✓ crayon, markers, or watercolor
- ✓ white chalk or crayon
- ✓ scissors
- ✓ glue



Directions:

1. Have students color and cut out the vehicle and road accessories on pages 14 & 15.
2. On a large piece of black construction paper, guide students as they draw a road/intersection using white chalk or paint.
3. Students can spend some time playing interactively on the "road".
4. Glue down the vehicles and road accessories to create a city street scene!

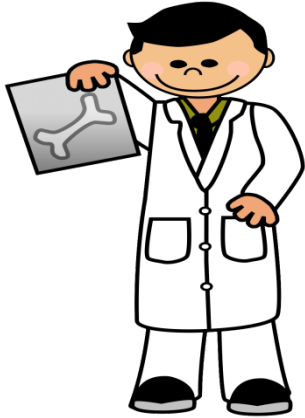

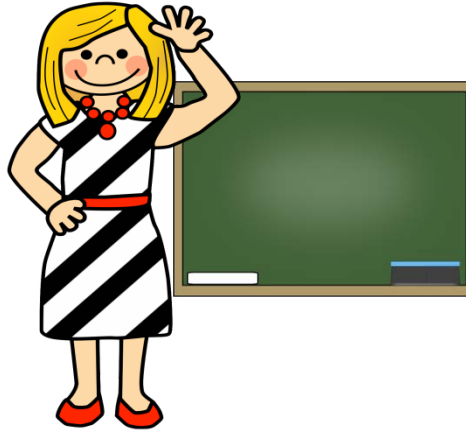

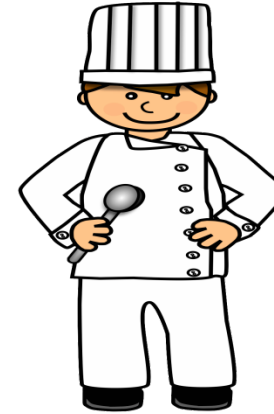

"HELPERS IN OUR TOWN" Song

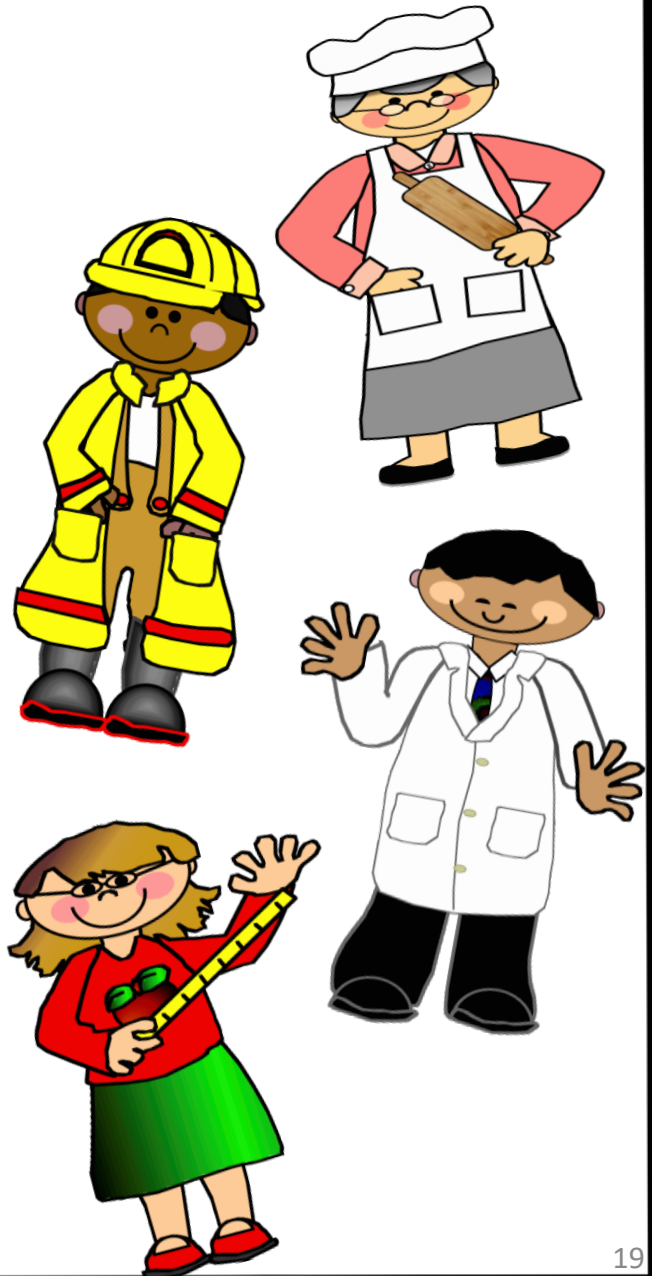
(To the tune of "This Old Man")

GAME IDEAS!



"Where's the Mail?"

Get an envelope and write on it to make it look like a letter.

Choose one child to be the mail carrier. They will need to figure out which child has the "mail".

Line the rest of the children up with their backs to the wall.

The mail carrier will face away from the children and close their eyes while you quietly hand off the mail to one of the other children.

All of the children must keep their hands behind their back.

The children say "mail carrier, mail carrier, where's the mail?"

The mail carrier turns around and gets three chances to pick which child is hiding the mail.

"I'm Lost!"

Choose a child to play the police officer and have them turn around and face away from the rest of the group. The teacher then will quietly point to one child from the group to be "lost".

Then the teacher calls out, "police officer, HELP, I lost my child!"

The police officer turns around and responds, "what does your child look like?"

The teacher gives the police officer 3 clues to help describe the lost child. If the child still needs help, have the students add more clues.

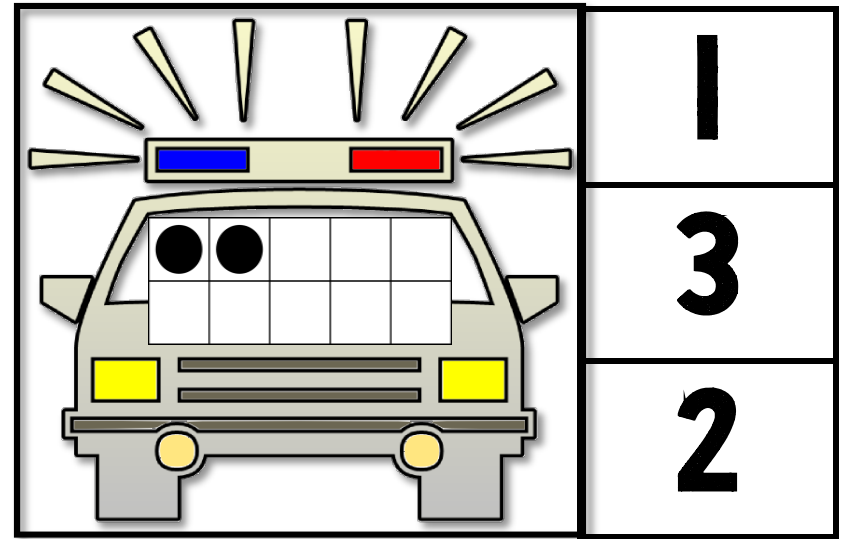
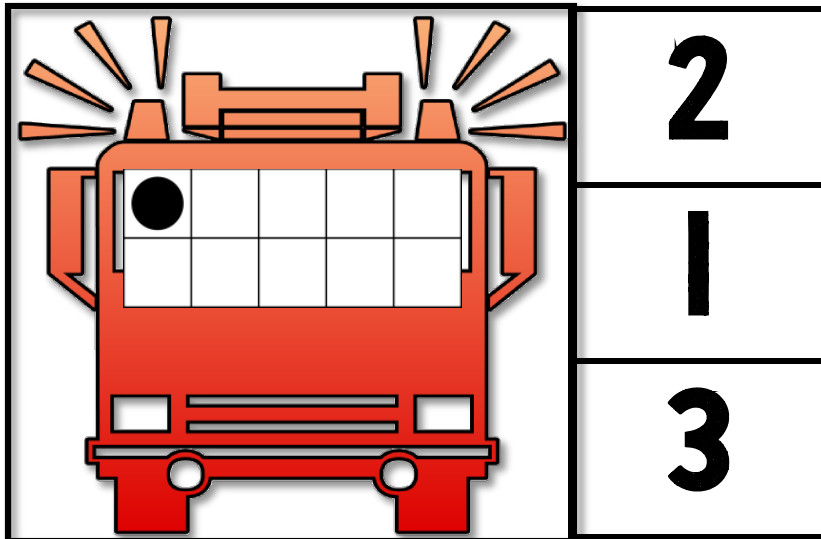
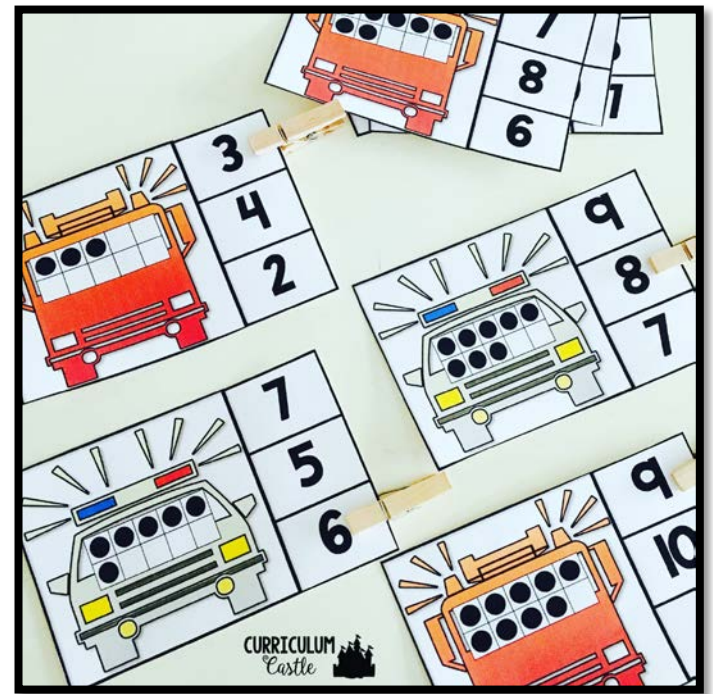
The lost child then gets to play the police officer and so on.

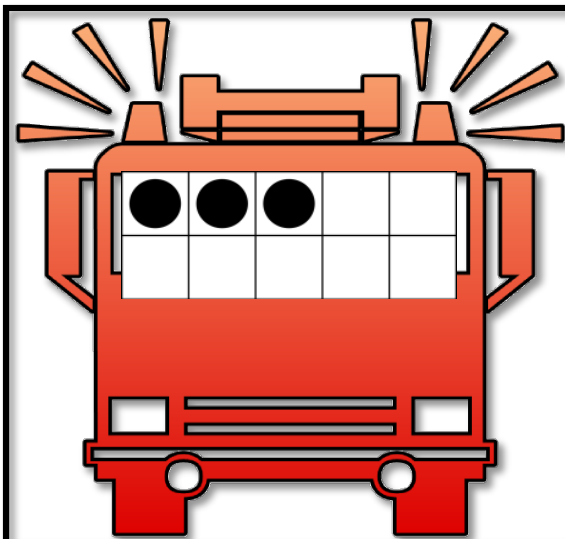
CODE 3 CLIP IT!

Optional: Use the printable on page 24 for extra practice if desired.

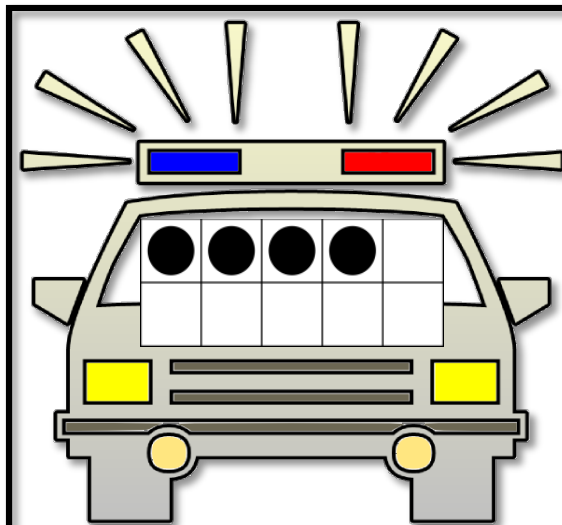
